### Future Rockhounds of America (FRA).

The big blue badge is available to kids <u>ages 6-17</u> who attend at <u>least 2</u> monthly meetings a year. Completion of <u>age-oriented</u> educational activities earns the junior **more** badges – see the chart on the next page! – as well as recognition on the national database of FRA.

Costs for this Juniors program is covered with the Family Membership in the Indian Mounds Rock & Mineral Club (IMRMC) \$25 per family per year. We regret we are not able to offer it as a drop-off program; Parent or other adult is required to be present at the adult meeting or assisting with Juniors for children to be in the Future Rockhounds program. This is all *HANDS-ON activity*: with visuals and full-color worksheets, interactive demonstrations, and samples for each kid to take home each time. These sessions will provide practice with real Rocks, Minerals and Fossils for homeschool students, Science Fair & Earth Science projects, and Science Olympiad competitions.

# Future Rockhounds of America (FRA) National Badge Program





- To earn a badge, the junior (age 6-17) completes at least 3 of the suggested activities for that badge. Then your FRA leader will sign and forward the completion sheet to the AFMS Juniors Program chair to receive your badge.
- (Kindergarten students who have older siblings in the program may attend for fun, but will not receive AFMS badges until they reach 1st grade level in skills and attention span. A Parent may be required to assist these younger ones in class; thanks for understanding ②.)
- Kids can earn 4-6 badges a year by participating in **the Juniors**Sessions at the Monthly meetings.
- They can ALSO do some badges on their own. Materials for several badges are available from the Juniors Coordinator.

- Once a junior earns 6 or more of the 21 badges, he/she will receive the official AFMS ROCKHOUND patch!
- Teens may also help as assistants in the sessions, working toward the Leadership and Communications badges.
- Cost for the badge program is covered in the annual Family Membership dues for the Indian Mounds Rock & Mineral Club!
